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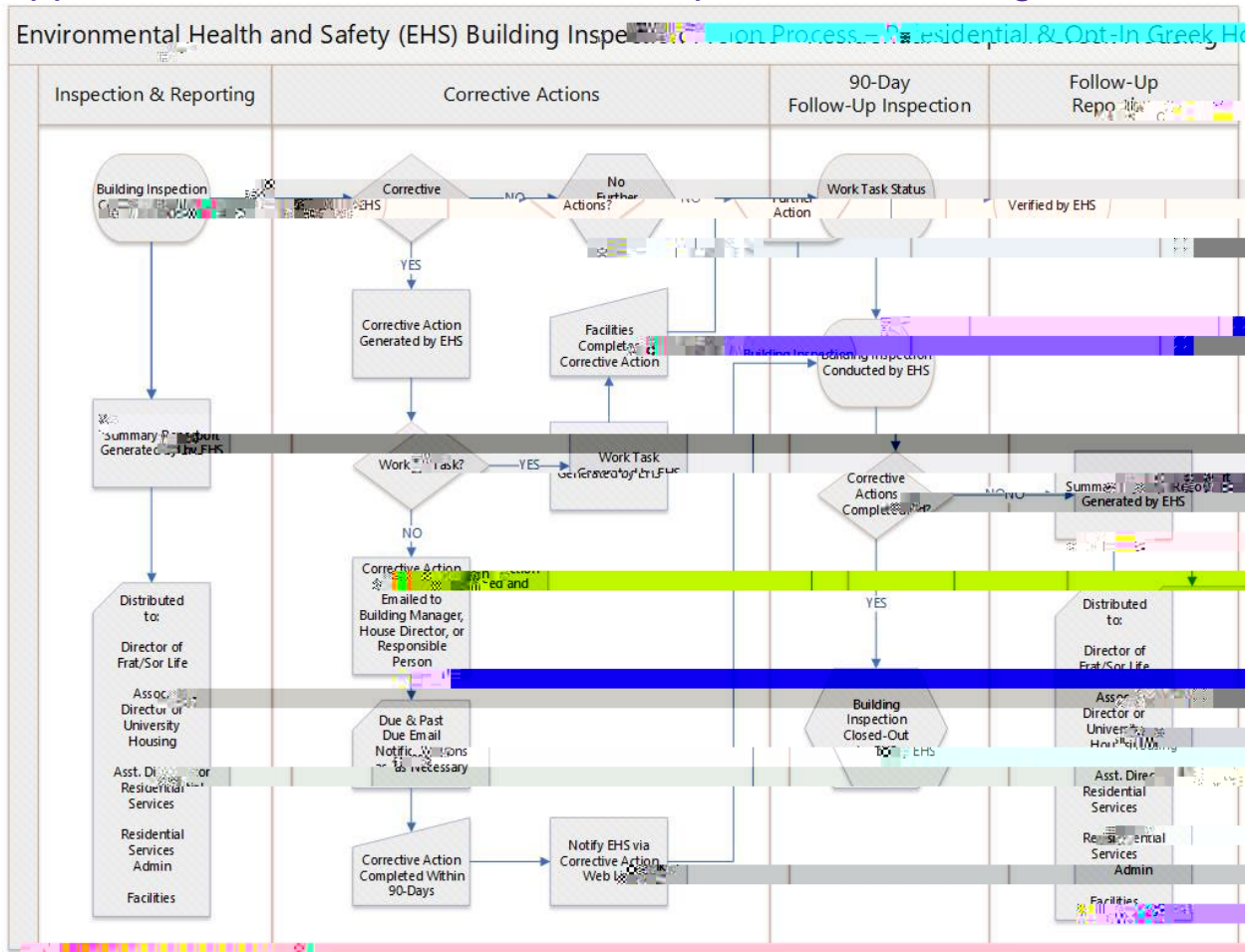


**B. General Procedures**

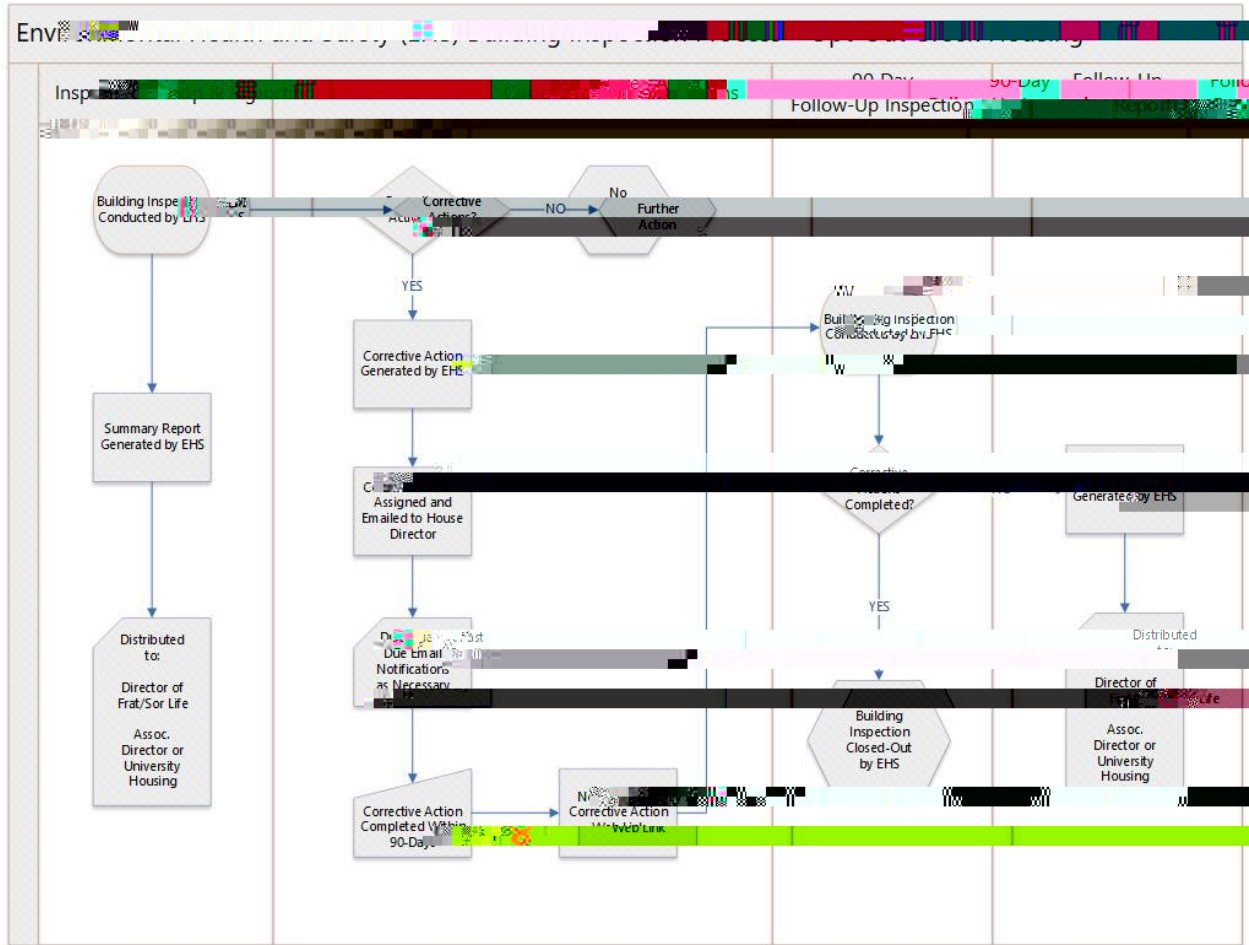
- i. Buildings will be inspected once every twelve months or whenever additional inspections are warranted or requested.
- ii. When necessary, buildings may be inspected based on priorities determined by building type, occupancy status, and hazards:
  - a. Level 1– Residential (e., dormitory, fraternity, sorority) buildings
  - b. Level 2– Science and critical buildings
  - c. Level 3– Medium to large buildings
  - d. Level 4– Small buildings
  - e. Level 5– Offline and underutilized buildings
- iii. Building inspections include, but are not limited to, common areas, stairwells, passageways, mechanical rooms, workshops, storage areas, loading docks, lavatories, janitorial rooms, kitchens, and exteriors.
- iv. In residential buildings sleeping rooms are inspected upon request and dw 12.087 0 T57-3 (ca

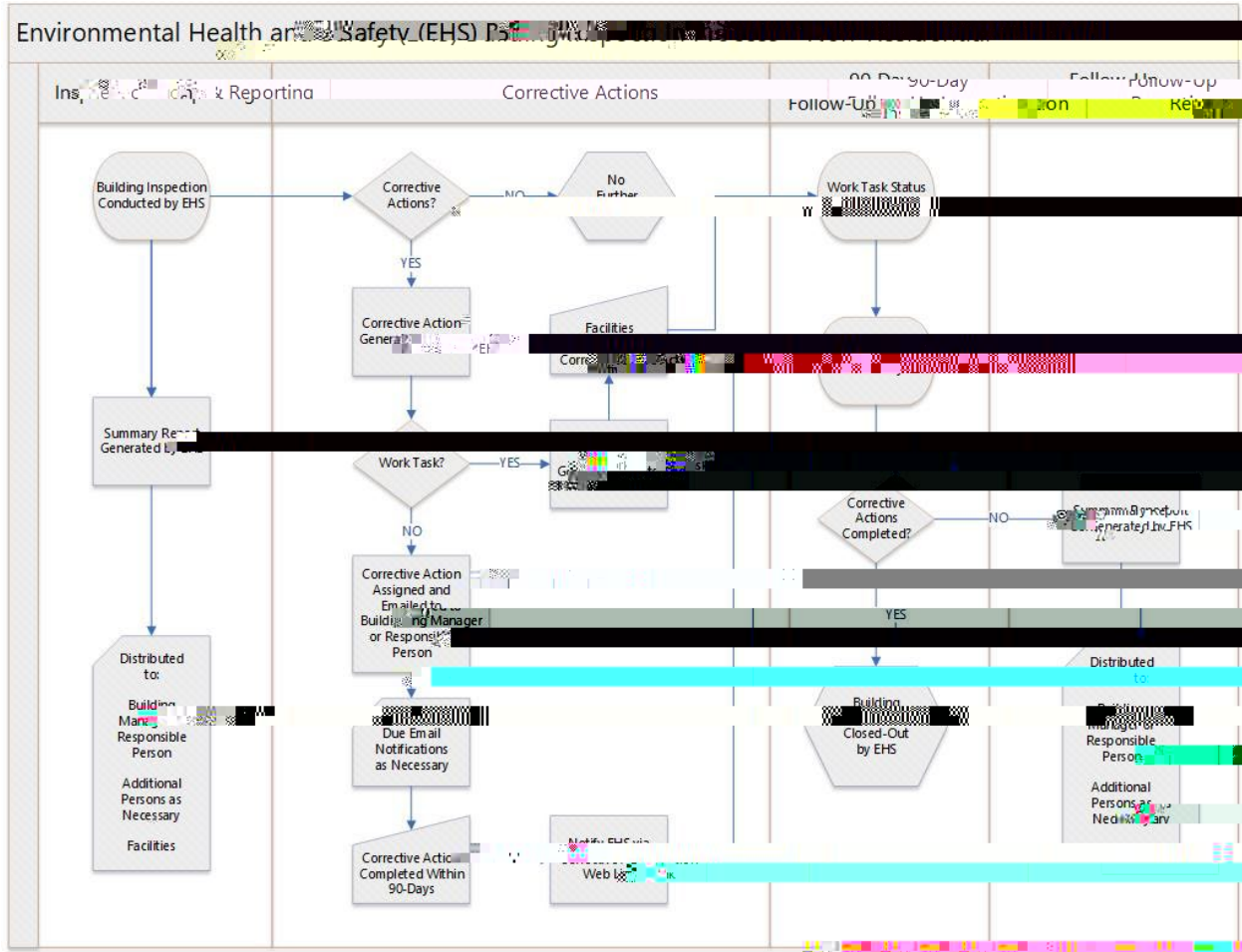
